Permit Stipulations

Please note that the following conditions must be met in order to protect participants, wildlife, and other users of the Sports Complex.

1. Your group is utilizing County property at its own risk. The County of Sacramento is not liable for injury or property damage.

Payment:

 How to pay. Accepted forms of payment include: Cash, Credit/Debit Card or Check. Please make checks made out to Sacramento County Treasurer. All Event fees must be paid in full at least 4 weeks prior to your event.

Parking:

- 3. Parking / Day Use Fees are required in conjunction with special event fees. Special event participants, volunteers, and spectators are required to entry fees upon entering the park in a motorized vehicle. Please inform participants, volunteers and spectators that all vehicles entering the park are subject to the standard vehicle entry fee or tournament parking rate.
- 4. Permittees doing hourly rentals may purchase parking entry to be included with permit fees.
- 5. All vehicles involved with your event must park in legal parking spaces.
- 6. Regional Parks recommends shuttle services and promoting bicycle use in order to reduce traffic congestion, and valet parking for bicycles.

Amplified Sound:

- 7. Music and Public Address systems can be used during events with a valid amplified sound permit. Amplified Sound Permits are \$30.00 and Sacramento County Regional Parks does not provide electricity for music or public address systems. An amplified sound permit <u>has not been</u> issued for this activity.
- 8. Please play music at a level as to not impact other park users. Please follow Ranger instructions if asked to lower the volume or turn in another direction.

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Vendors:

- The selling or offering for sale any goods, services, liquids or edibles for human consumption is prohibited without proper approvals. All state and local regulations must be met before such sales are allowed.
 NO VENDORS <u>HAVE NOT</u> BEEN APPROVED FOR THIS ACTIVITY.
- 10. All beverage and food sales are required to comply with all local and state health and safety codes and regulations. Permits are required from the Sacramento County Department of Environmental Health for each beverage/food vendor. County Dept. of Health can be reached at (916) 876-7221.
- 11. All grease and oils from cooking will be removed from Park. No illegal dumping of grease or oils on Park grounds, in trash cans, or dumpsters is allowed. No food, liquid, ice, or any other substance may be dumped on Park grounds.
- 12. Please discuss the placement of vendor booths and/or vehicles with Parks staff. Please advise vendors that they may drive only on designated areas. No one is allowed to Park or unload on the grass.
- 13. Please make sure that any markings for the event be made with removable chalk or removable paint chalk material that is easily removed. No permanent markings for the event will be allowed.
- 14. Please advise vendors that they will need to provide their own generators for electrical needs.

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Security & Alcohol:

- 15. Alcohol may be permitted during events, except in park areas where alcohol is prohibited. Requesting the presence, consumption, and/or sale of alcohol has some very specific requirements, including needing a permit, as follows: No alcoholic beverages shall be sold at any special event without a valid A.B.C. license on file with Parks staff. The valid A.B.C. license will be presented at least 2 weeks prior to the scheduled event date. Sales shall be limited to an enclosed "beer garden" area.
- 16. Permittee is required to provide security for crowd control and internal security. Organizer has agreed to provide volunteers.
- 17. There will be limited County Park Rangers assigned to this area for your event. You are responsible for the safety and security of your group at all times. Please be aware that Park personnel are very limited.

Waste Removal/Dumpsters:

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- 18. All garbage and debris associated with this activity is to be picked up, removed and placed in proper receptacles. Violations of this may terminate your rights to use the facility again. You will be billed if extra County staff is required for your activity.
- 19. Glass bottles or containers are prohibited in Regional Parks.
- 20. Permittee will work with Sacramento Local Conservation Corps on a recycling plan, or work with another organization to do recycling at the Event.

Use Restrictions:

- 21. The use of signs on trees is strictly prohibited. Stakes inserted into the ground are not allowed on irrigated surfaces without permission from the Department. All other stakes shall be placed in safe area so they are not hazardous to people, the natural environment, emergency vehicle or maintenance vehicles.
- 22. No aerial flying or drone type cameras are permitted.
- 23. Special Events shall minimize impact the Park's cultural and natural resources. Environmental reviews may be required for some special events.
- 24. No person shall willfully injure or destroy any cultural or natural resource. No vehicles are allowed on lawns or closed areas without special permission from Parks staff.
- 25. Please stay out of designated sensitive habitat areas.
- 26. The County of Sacramento prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, age or disability in its programs or activities.

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Warning: The smoking or ingesting of marijuana or marijuana products is not allowed with Sacramento County Regional Parks and cannot be allowed via the permit process. The applicable Health and Safety code section is listed below related specifically to Sacramento County Regional Park properties.

11362.3.HS

(a) Nothing in Section 11362.1 shall be construed to permit any person to:

(1) Smoke or ingest marijuana or marijuana products in any public place, except in accordance with Section 26200 of the Business and Professions Code.

(2) Smoke marijuana or marijuana products in a location where smoking tobacco is prohibited.

General Permit Stipulations

INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS

- Permittee shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the County of Sacramento, its governing Board, officers, directors, officials, employees, and authorized volunteers and agents, (collectively "County Parties"), from and against any and all claims, demands, actions, losses, liabilities, damages, and all expenses and costs incidental thereto, including cost of defense, settlement, arbitration, expert fees, and reasonable attorneys' fees, sustained by any person or to any property in, on, or about the rented premises, resulting from injuries to or death of any person, and damage to or destruction of property or loss of use or reduction in value thereof, arising out of, pertaining to, or resulting from the acts or omissions of Permittee, its employees, volunteers, agents, contractors, or guests.
- The provisions of this Indemnity shall survive the expiration or termination of this Permit.

INSURANCE

Liability insurance is required for all events. Commercial entities renting the facility that have a
Commercial General Liability insurance policy will be able to satisfy the insurance requirements by having
their broker or agent issue an <u>ACORD 25 Certificate of Insurance</u> in compliance with the requirements
listed below. For individuals, their homeowners' policies will not meet the requirements. Individuals will be
able to purchase a Special Events insurance policy for their event. The policy will protect both the
Permittee and the County and meets all the requirements below. No event will be allowed without the
insurance requirements being met.

This checklist will help you and your insurance representative when reviewing your policy:

- Policy shall be on an occurrence form
- The occurrence limit :\$1,000,000 (minimum); aggregate limit: \$2,000,000 (minimum)
- Fire Damage to Premises Rented occurrence limit \$100,000
- Medical Payments (any one person) \$5,000
- County of Sacramento, its governing Board, officers, directors, officials, employees, and authorized agents and volunteers are included as additional insureds ("County Parties")
- Coverage shall be primary and non-contributory
- If a caterer is used and is serving liquor, the caterer must carry Liquor Liability insurance with limits not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. The caterer must include the County Parties as additional insureds.
- Certificate needs to be on file at least 3 weeks prior to your event.

COMPLIANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE LAW, RULES, & REGULATIONS

- 1. Permittee shall comply with all local, state, and federal laws and regulations related to the use of the facility and public gatherings.
- 2. Permittee agrees to abide by all applicable local, federal, and state accessibility standards and regulations.
- 3. Permittee further agrees that it is solely responsible for reviewing and ensuring compliance with all applicable public health rules, regulations, orders, and/or guidance in effect at the time of the use of the facility including, but not limited to, physical distancing, limits on the size of gatherings, use of appropriate sanitation practices, etc.
- 4. Sacramento County reserves the right to immediately revoke Permittee's right to use of the facility under this agreement should Permittee fail to comply with any provision of this section.

FORCE MAJEURE

Force Majeure Events: Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this agreement, Sacramento County shall be excused from its obligations under this agreement to the extent and whenever it shall be prevented from the performance of such obligations by any Force Majeure Event. For purposes of this agreement, a "Force Majeure Event" includes but is not limited to fires, floods, earthquakes, pandemic, epidemic, civil disturbances, acts of terrorism, regulation of any public authority, and other causes beyond their control. The Permittee waives any right of recovery against Sacramento County and the Permittee shall not charge results of "acts of God" to Sacramento County, its officers, employees, or agents.

Regional Parks reserves the right to modify, revoke or cancel any permit issued at any time at the Department's discretion.

Sacramento County Regional Parks wants this event to be successful, safe, and well organized for the enjoyment of the community. Please work closely with Parks staff in keeping them updated and informed of any changes.
